


This limited 1 (one) year warranty DOES NOT COVER the following:

- 1. Defects or damage arising from shipping, installation, alterations, accidents, abuse, misuse, lack of proper maintenance and use of other than genuine Subzero replacement parts, in all cases whether caused by a contractor, service company, the owner or any other person.
- 2. Deterioration through normal wear and tear.
- 3. Damages resulting from abuse or misuse from failure to install or maintain this product in accordance with the written instructions furnished by Subzero Engineering.
- 4. Use of Cleaning Products Containing Calcium Hypo Chlorite (Chlorine), Scouring Powders or pads shall not be covered.
- 5. Expense of normal maintenance.
- 6. All costs of removal, transportation, labor, re-installation or other costs including postage and/or shipping costs to obtain warranty service shall be paid by the customer.
- 7. Any liability for consequential or incidental damages, all of which are hereby expressly disclaimed, and implied warranties, including those of merchantability or fitness for purpose intended are specifically excluded. PRE-ASSEMBLY

Planning Assembly

Unpack all hardware and items from boxes. Separate and lay all parts on a flat, non-abrasive surface. Compare all items received against the included Parts List or Bill of Material.

What's Included

- Essential Series Sliding Door
- Adjustable Rack Cleats
- Floor Cleats
- 1/4" 20 x 3/4" Bolts & Nuts
- #14 x 1" Self-Drilling Screws
- #14 x 2" Self-Drilling Screws

- 3/8" Hex Socket
- Level
- Tape Measure


ASSEMBLY

Step 1: Removing the Shipping Bar

- ☐ The Essential Series Sliding Door will arrive with a shipping bar attached across the bottom to maintain the correct dimensions and prevent the frame from bending during shipping.
- ☐ For single doors, the shipping bar is attached underneath the door frame. Remove the shipping bar first.
- ☐ For dual doors, the shipping bar is attached in front of the door frame. Leave the bar attached until Step 3 is completed.



SINGLE DOOR




DUAL DOOR

Step 2: Attaching the Adjustable Rack Cleats

- ☐ Dry fit the adjustable rack cleat from the top of the rack to the back or side of the door.
- ☐ Make sure the door is plumb, level, and square. Note: Racks may not be level, so a slight gap may be required behind the door frame.
- \square After determining the optimal location for the cleat, use the provided #14 x 1" self-drilling screws to fasten cleat to the door frame, then to the top of the rack with the provided 1/4" 10 x 3/4" bolts.
- ☐ Repeat process on both sides and ensure door is still level.

NOTE: It is important not to drill cleat into top 2" of door frame (header), this will interfere with the self-closer. Contact the factory for special hardware if no other mounting locations are feasible.



The cleat swivels to allow fastening to existing rack holes without drilling additional holes.

Step 3: Installing the Floor Cleats

- ☐ Measure the door frame diagonals to ensure the door is still square before fastening the floor cleats.
- ☐ Test the sliding function of the door and make any adjustments as needed, then fasten the pre-attached floor cleats to the ground.
- □ A #14 x 2" self-drilling screw is provided for raised floor applications, other hardware is available upon request.
- ☐ For double doors, remove the shipping bar after securing floor cleats.

NOTE: Single doors will include a loose 2" x 2" angle cleat, to secure to the side without a pre-attached cleat, using the same hardware.





Step 4: Adjusting the Speed of the Closer (If Equipped)

This section also serves as instructions for installing the closer in a manual sliding door, follow the steps in reverse.

The closer should come preset at the recommended speed. However, if you want to adjust the speed, you will need to dismount the closer to access the Speed Adjustment Screw.

☐ Remove the screw that secures the mounting bracket to the door. This screw should come installed a little loose which allows the bracket to "float" and the door to close properly.





☐ Loosen the set screw with the provided hex key.


NOTE: Do not fully remove the set screw. It is very small and likely to fall and vanish. We have provided a spare, just in case.





- ☐ Remove the closer. The opposite end will have the Speed Adjustment Screw.
- □ Rotate 1/2 turn clockwise for slower speed (S) or counter-clockwise for faster (F).





☐ Reinstall the closer, set screw, and mounting bracket.

NOTE: After tightening the mounting bracket screw, just barely "crack" or untighten it with a screw driver. It should be a little loose to the touch. Failure to do so could prevent the door from closing properly.

- ☐ Test the closing speed.
- ☐ Repeat Step 4 if desired.



CLEANING

- ☐ Use a soft cloth, mild detergent and water.
- \square Do not use any abrasive pads or materials.
- ☐ Do not use harsh solvents or thinners.
